Hyderabad, March 13, 2020: Arrow Aircraft, a Delhi-based non-scheduled operator has received its first H125 Airbus helicopter. The aircraft taken on lease from Heliswiss Iberica will soon start operations in the high altitude areas of north India for heli-pilgrimage (passenger transport) missions.

The H125 is a member of Airbus’ rugged and proven Ecureuil family (AS350, AS355, AS550, AS555, H125, H125M, EC130, H130), which has accumulated more than 33 million flight hours worldwide. Some 6,500 helicopters have been delivered in nearly 120 countries for more than 1,900 operators. The H125 is the undisputed leader in its class for the past 30 years.
